

HELP INCREASE UNDERSTANDING OF TURNER'S SYNDROME

We need your help in a research project to increase our understanding of Turner's Syndrome. We are researchers from Monash University, Southern Health, the Jean Hailes Foundation for Women's Health, the Royal Children's Hospital, and the University of Melbourne.

We are researching the changes in brain structure and function that may occur in women who have Turner's Syndrome (TS). We are interested in understanding what strengths and weaknesses in thinking processes, like memory and language, women with TS may have compared to women without TS. Participants will also have an MRI scan of their brain.

We are inviting women aged 18 and over who have XO TS and women who don't have TS to be part of our project.
